The implementation of that initiative resulted in marked improvements in students' attitudes to learning and an increase in their test scores.

Before these experiences, Mr. Bagnato worked with an educational facility for boys with behavioral disabilities. He taught and mentored school-aged males, led to their rehabilitation and reintegration to the regular school settings. This experience makes Mr. Bagnato an excellent fit for working with youths of various backgrounds, and for supporting educators in their efforts to effectively serve students of varied educational capabilities.
